THE YORTEX BY THOSE COWFRD

The Vortex crystallises all the anxiety of the early 1920s, post-war twitchiness, glossed over by martinis and cigarettes. Coward explores the darker side of the Cocktail Party set; emotional blackmail, drug abuse and shattered relationships are minutely observed in this disturbing, early piece from a playwright whose sharp eye was more usually turned towards the light.

Coward's central characters are like specks of dirt approaching the plughole of a draining bath. The closer they get to the hole, the faster they spiral. Florence is desperate to hold onto her youth, even if it's only through her toy-boy lover. But when Florence's son returns with a fiancée in tow, a crisis occurs and the stage is set for a blistering confrontation.

The Vortex was the play that made Coward's name and firmly established him as both a dramatist and an actor - he'd been at pains to ensure the play included "a whacking good part" for himself - and it was the roaring twenties equivalent of today's so-called in-yer-face theatre, the 'Shopping and F***ing' of the jazz age.

'Firstly I'd like to thank OTTC and especially Michael Bull for the opportunity to work with such a fantastic company, talented actors and technicians and the expertise of Mike for an invaluable experience that has taught me so much. I've learned not only about directing but also the many skills required to bring a play like this to life and do it justice.

The reason I love this play so much is because it feels like we are transported back to an era and segment of society that has no parallel in modern times. Coward has captured for us a unique moment that has left me nostalgic for it and almost sad there are no Pawnies or Florences left in the world.

We can all relate to glamour, self deception and superficiality, and the characters and dialogue are so 'beautifully preserved' we feel we are getting a real glimpse of the times in which Coward lived and the darker side of his usually frothy world. So much so that sitting in the audience we could almost be another guest at Florence Lancaster's lavish house party.'
